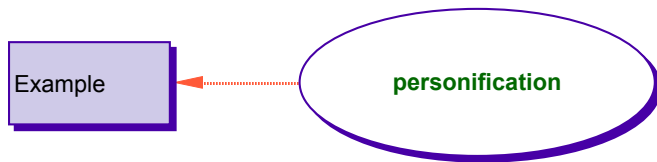
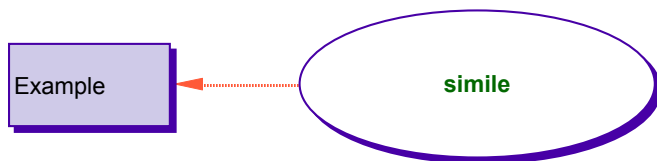
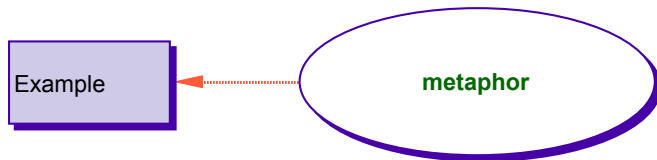


How to use this template
